The Old Ways: A Journey on Foot By Robert Macfarlane

Dunton Delvers book group tackled this in July with very mixed responses! Our meetings are held every 6 weeks or so and it has to be said that the discussion is often all the more lively if we disagree about a book!

This book is definitely one of those 'Marmite' books! I was the one who suggested we read it and, unsurprisingly, I loved it. One other member of our group also enjoyed it but the rest were singularly unimpressed, with many not completing it.

The Old Ways is the story of many journeys along paths in the British Isles and further afield in Spain, Palestine and Tibet. Robert Macfarlane obviously considers each walk a journey and the book delves back into the history of the 'old ways' which are now often forgotten as we speed past in the car.

Some of the language is quite challenging'Leys, dykes, drongs, sarns, snickets....bostles, shuts, driftways, lichways, ridings....' But fortunately there is a glossary.

As a walker myself, this book just urged me to don my boots, pick up my rucksack and set off, although I do draw the line at curling up in a hedge at the end of the day like the author! If you enjoy walking and discovering the history of places, you may enjoy this book but be warned, it's not for everyone!!

Finally I have heard that when Mrs Curry the Head teacher at Dunton School recently retired she was presented with a rucksack and this book and fortunately she loves it!!

Dunton Folk - What's it all about?

Dunton Folk was started in 2012 by two folk music enthusiasts, Simon Bailes and Andy Barwell. Both are fans of folk music, attending folk clubs and festivals regularly. The idea was to bring folk music into the village as a community event to involve as many local people as possible. Four concerts were arranged in the first year, along with a monthly music session and the first annual Dunton Wassail.

The venue for the Dunton Folk concerts is St Mary Magdalene Church. A beautiful fifteenth century (at least bits of it!) building, the acoustics are perfect for live music. The church provides a stage and we provide a PA system with Simon acting as sound engineer for the concerts. Early on we took the decision to book the better known names in the folk world to ensure we got the best performances possible. However, to continue the theme of local involvement we provide a support act for each concert and these are drawn from local and up and coming musicians.

The concerts are very much a team effort and they wouldn't be possible without the help of the team of volunteers who help with publicity, providing beds for the performers, selling tickets and helping to set up and take down the PA system. Thank you to everyone who helps. We have had support from The March Hare freehouse at every one of our concerts too. John and Janice provide a fully stocked bar providing local beer and cider and a range of other drinks. After all, what is folk music without a nice glass of ale? (NOTE False beards and spare jumpers are available at all of our concerts!).

Folk music sessions are held in The March Hare on the first Tuesday of every month. These are an informal event where musicians come along and join in an evening of music making with songs, tunes and even the occasional poem and joke thrown in for good measure.

To top off the Dunton Folk offering we have the annual Dunton Wassail. Held on the first Saturday of the year at Church Farm (cunningly located behind the Church!) it is a celebration of both folk tradition and Simon's other passion, cider making (see www.franklinscider.co.uk). The evening involves mulled cider, Morris dancing, hanging toast soaked in cider in the trees in the orchard, singing wassail songs to the trees and finally making lots of noise (saucepan lids and wooden spoons are essential) to wake up the apple trees and to ward off evil spirits. Once this is done we all retire to The March Hare for a mummers play and an evening of spectacular folk music.

Here's the marketing bit now. Dunton Folk only works when there are people to enjoy our events. Come along to one of our events. There is no charge for the wassail or for the monthly session in The March Hare. We charge for the concerts in the church but accompanied under 16s go free. Details of all of our events are on our web site, www.duntonfolk.co.uk.

Makes 12 big muffin sized cakes


175g Self-Raising Flour
1 1/2 level tsp baking powder
175g butter softened
175g caster sugar
3 large free range eggs
2tbsp milk

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4 Line a muffin tray with 12 paper muffin cases

Sift the flour and baking powder into a large bowl, then add the butter, caster sugar, eggs and milk. Beat together until well mixed.

Spoon into the cases and bake for about 20 minutes or until the tops spring back when lightly pressed. Cool on a wire rack.

When cold decorate with your chosen topping.

Every volunteer has had to take on a responsibility and communicate with others to ensure creativity flourished in the garden.

Volunteer gardeners have had to plan and grow everything in the garden. They didn't always get it right but through shared experiences they have learnt a lot. Everyone reliably got stuck into the dirty, heavy, sometimes tedious tasks as well as the more enjoyable aspects of communal gardening.

Potted History of a Village Shop

By the 1860s there was at least one general store in each village, many in houses with added shop fronts. This may have been the situation in Dunton because old photos indicate that the original shop was the front room of a terraced house. Also during the Victorian era the village shop was often sited near the village pub as in the case of Dunton because the shop and pub were opposite one another and now the shop has moved into the pub!

Unlike some of our Victorian counterparts, John and Janice will not adulterate the products sold nor sell you a short measure, neither will they barter or extend credit!

In the Victorian era the shop keeper was a man of modest status. He was friendly with everyone but had few close friends because of the long hours he worked.

In the Victorian era of the sales on a Saturday in a village shop exceeded the total sales of the seven previous days.

Even in Victorian times the village shopkeeper had a battle on their hands with town shopkeepers because local 'carrier services' would make use of better roads and take villagers into towns for their shopping or offered to do their shopping for them and deliver it to their door. Nothing new there then!

Victorian village shops acted as post offices. The post box is still in its original site ie the old village shop and post office.

By the beginning of the 20th century the village shop became the focal point of the community. They were often sited close to the heart of the village and the shop became the place where the locals met to exchange news.

In between the war years home baking and cooking declined. During these years individuals were developing an awareness of healthier eating. No change there then, either.

Once upon a time, the village shop was the heart of the community, John, Janice and the volunteers now want the Dunton community to be the heart of the March Hare Community Shop. Source Shire Publications, Oxford



Woolf Tracks - What is a Serving?

Most of us are aware that we need to eat a balanced diet which includes fresh vegetables and fruit, whole grains, meat, oily fish and some diary but how much of each should we eat and just how much is a serving?

According to the NHS we should be applying the Eat Well Plate on a daily basis. Roughly speaking a third of food intake should be derived from vegetables and fruit, a third from bread, rice, potatoes or pasta (or carbohydrates) and the remaining third split between meat and fish, milk and dairy foods and those foods and drinks high in fat or sugar. Note the foods and drinks high in fat or sugar takes the smallest proportion.

Depending on age, gender and activity levels let us consider what the average adult requires on a daily basis. Generally speaking most women require six servings and most men eight servings of carbohydrates per day. A serving comprises of; one slice of bread, two or three crackers or crisp breads, three dessert spoonful's of dry porridge, three dessert spoonful's of boiled rice or pasta. Ideally some if not all should be of a wholegrain variety, and highly processed or refined forms of carbohydrates should be limited.

Vegetables and fruit is the one we are probably most familiar with. We should aim for a minimum of five servings a day but ideally more than that if possible. Fresh is always preferable, from your own garden is ideal but frozen and canned do make good alternatives. A serving comprises of; one medium apple or pear, one orange, one medium banana, two small fruits such as a kiwi or plum, 10 to 12 berries such as grapes or cherries or a bowl of homemade vegetable soup.

Adults should aim for 3 servings a day of milk and dairy products. They are an excellent source of calcium which is essential to bone growth and repair. A serving comprises of; a 200ml glass of semi skimmed milk, 50g of low fat soft cheese, 125ml pot of yoghurt or a 25g (matchbox sized) portion of cheddar cheese.

Adults should aim to have two servings of meat, fish, eggs and beans or other sources of nondairy protein a day. Ideally they should be lean cuts of meat or oily fish. A serving comprises of either; 100g of raw meat or a packet of card sized serving of cooked meat, 100g cooked fish, 100g soya based protein, 2 eggs or 40g of unsalted nuts.

Fats and oils are essential to the body in small amounts. Ideally we should aim for five to six teaspoons on a daily basis. One serving literally means one teaspoon of oil or one heaped teaspoon or mini pack of spread, which is sufficient to cover two slices of bread. Other sources of oils which you could consider include olives, approximately eight olives equal one teaspoon of oil or half a medium avocado is equal to three teaspoons of oil. It is important to consider how your food is cooked as it is easy to put extra oil or fat into the cooking process when it is not required.

Finally to those foods and drinks which are high in fat, sugar and/or salt. These should be limited to one a day but ideally not every day. There are plenty of healthy alternatives to these types of foods including fresh vegetables, fruit or water! One serving comprises of four squares of chocolate or one fun sized bar, one cereal bar or two plain biscuits.
