Quick Lemon Curd

2 large eggs 75g caster sugar 3 lemons, zest of 1 and juice of 2 50g unsalted butter

Put all ingredients in a bowl except the butter and place over a pan of hot water, whisk in the butter a little at a time, stir until thick. Cool in a separate bowl and cover with cling film.

Swiss roll tin 35x25cm 50g butter 50g caster sugar 2 large eggs 110g s/r flour Zest of 1 lemon 1 tablespoon hot water

Line the cake tin with parchment, heat oven to 190 c/375 f/gas 5. Put all ingredients in a bowl and whisk until thick. Spread into the tin and bake for 8-10 mins, or firm to the touch.

Remove from oven and leave for 5 mins in the tin, invert cake onto a piece of parchment, cover with a damp cloth and leave for 5 mins.

Roll cake up with a piece of parchment inside and leave to go cold.

Filling

250g mascarpone 200g fromage frais 1 level desert spoon caster sugar 110g strawberries

Whisk together the mascarpone fromage frais and sugar.

Unroll the cake, spread with lemon curd then mascarpone cream and slice the strawberries on top, then roll up.

Combine the remaining lemon curd and cream mixture together and serve alongside the roulade.



Latest news on Central Beds Council's application for a traveller site on the edge of Dunton

Central Bedfordshire Council are seeking to put a Traveller site just outside Dunton. For previous news on the application, please go to my facebook page www.facebook.com/adamzernyand read my update for 28th March or go to: http://tinyurl.com/znwsqaq

The application went in earlier this year and Central Beds Council's Planning Department have so far received over 100 objections to their application from local residents and local councillors.

Planning officers recently wrote to the council's Housing Department (who put in the application) with a number of concerns. However, these should not be taken to mean they will reject it, merely that they want more information before they can make a decision. You can see these concerns on my facebook page, the post is dated 3rd June. The Housing Department have since responded to Planning officers and this means the application now has to be re-consulted. If you have already commented, you don't need to do so again.

The next step will be for the council's Development Management Committee to make a final decision. This meeting is almost certain to take place on 29th June, beginning at 10am. This meeting will take place at Priory House, Chicksands, SG17 5TQ, so if you'd like to attend, it might be worth booking the time off now.



What is a Town/Parish Council?

Town/Parish Councils make up the first tier of local government in England and are the layer of local government closest to the communities they represent. There are some 8,500 Councils at Parish level in England. As a tier of local government they are elected bodies with discretionary powers and rights laid down by Parliament to represent their communities.

What is our Council responsible for?

The Parish Council currently has responsibility for Dunton Cemetery; Maintenance of churchyard; Parish Council owned street lighting; Grass cutting verges in Parish; Noticeboard adjacent bottle bank.

How are these managed?

Dunton Parish Council has 7 Councillors who work for the community. The Council meets bi-monthly, usually on the 3rd Wednesday of the month, and members of the public are very welcome to attend. Details of meetings are put on the noticeboard and on the website. The dates for 2016-2017 are:-

20.7.16, 21.9.16, 16.11.16, 18.1.17, 15.3.17 and 17.5.17

Dunton Lower School in the late 1800s and early 1900s

In the late 1800s and early 1900s Dunton Lower School was closed when required because of illness, weather or the demands of agriculture. Not sure how this would fit in with working parents today.

The school was closed from the 7.4.1902 to the 26.5.1902 because "measles was running right through all parts of the village."

Holidays were also timed to coincide with the farmers' needs for child labour in charlock pulling, harvesting, haymaking, stone picking and potato picking. Charlock or Common Mustard was a weed in grain fields. Picking stones out of the fields by hand would be back breaking work. In 1902 the school closed from the 15.8,1902 to 29.9,1902.

The winter of 1900 was severe an unending and even on the 1.5.1901 the school was "obliged to have fires."

In 1902 the boys could apply for a half time certificate which meant that half of each day could be spent in the harvest fields. Life was dominated by farm work. Life was hard.

Although life was tough in Dunton during the winter months at the turn of the century during the Victorian era, the long dark days were brightened by local events such as magic lantern shows, dances and meetings of the Band of Hope. The Band of Hope educated young children about the evils of drugs and alcohol.

The children at Dunton School had an inspiring morning at the school on Empire Day, 24.5.1905. "The children assembled at the usual time in the morning and the room was prettily decorated. Two Union Jacks were flying on the school building outside. Several of the parents came in at 10 0'clock, with the vicar and Mrs Adams. A map of the world was hung up and the children came out and placed some toy Union Jacks in those parts of the map belonging to our Empire. We were not able to show every possession as there were not sufficient flags. This was followed by a short and very appropriate address from the vicar, who, after speaking about the many and various products of our Empire in all parts of the world, showed that it would be perfectly possible for us to maintain ourselves without ever going to the "foreigner" and demonstrated the meaning of "United we stand, divided we fall" by a bundle of sticks and a single stick."

The "Hare Raisers" Book Club Review. "The Miniatrist" By Jessie Burton

Jessie Burton's debut novel is set in 1686 Amsterdam, the Dutch Golden Age.

18 year old Petronella Oortman, arrives in the city to begin a new life as the wife of a wealthy, merchant trader whom she has only met once, fleetingly before they married. She does not receive a warm welcome in her new home and thus the story in this house of secrets unfolds with many surprises and revelations.

The book is beautifully written and is set against a backdrop of historical fact because Petronella lived at that time and her life has been recorded. Amsterdam in the 17th Century was incredibly wealthy due to its trading capabilities and this contrasts with its pious, repressive society that elicits a harsh, unforgiving character to people who didn't fit into the tight laws and cultural norms expected of them. I found that my prejudices and values were constantly challenged regarding injustices within the book which often paralleled Petronella's experience.

The focus of the novel is the wedding gift from her husband, a cabinet replica of their house (a usual gift for new brides at that time) and Petronella commissions a miniaturist to furnish the house. This is where the mystery deepens......no spoilers... but suffice to say that nothing is predictable and relationships aren't what the reader would assume. Nella's life oscillates between the secrets of the household and the world of trade, I found Nella's journey from a hesitant young girl to an astute, strong woman fascinating.

Members of our group had varied and diverse views of the book which made a discussion full of interest and energy! Claire Short

The Dunton Community Garden

Recently the volunteers and trustees of Dunton Garden injected the word 'community' back into its name because we felt that being part of and run by the local community was fundamental to our ethos. Well, we had to do something during the long non-gardening months of winter so hearty discussions in the March Hare it was. The garden was very much part of the community in its early days, having evolved from open sessions in Jenny Pates's garden in the village, but generous grants initially and then the need to bring in funds shifted the focus a bit. Paid staff took responsibility for most of the work towards making it grow and thrive and volunteers became a sort of 'workforce' rather than the driving force of the garden. As a result the organisation's horizons were wider but local ownership reduced.

Finding ourselves unable to raise funds to pay staff, volunteers took over all responsibility for the garden and reclaimed the original ethos of the garden and it has never felt or looked better. Not all the volunteers live in Dunton but many do and they work at creating events and activities that bring people into the garden, so, the garden is yours to enjoy, come on in and find out what's in it for you.

For example, look out for monthly Saturday morning Coffee Mornings in the garden. Bring the kids, bring the dog (on a lead please) and get to know the garden and its people. Also keep an eye out for special events such as The Big Lunch in June or, for the more adventurous, our Camping in the Garden weekend in August and keep checking out the produce on the Dunton Garden trolley and do remember that you can just walk around the garden at any time.

The Parish Church of St Mary Magdalene

The first mention of the Church of St. Mary, Dunton is in 1189. Nothing remains of this first Church and in the early 14th century rebuilding in stone began with the south aisle, nave and chancel. This first phase was clearly very ambitious, for the east end of the aisle was laid out as a Lady Chapel with wall brackets for statues on each side of the altar and a magnificent east window. It was not until the early 15th century that the north aisle and north arcade of the nave were constructed and clerestory windows added over the nave.

Only the arch at the west end of the nave remains from the original tower which fell down in the 17th century and by 1861 work had started to rebuild several parts of the Church. The tower was rebuilt and a small vestry added to the north side of the chancel. The chancel was restored by the second Earl Brownlow and given a new and elaborate hammerbeam roof with twelve carved angels.

Over the centuries there have been many changes; some big, some small. In addition to the ongoing restoration and upkeep of this fine Church by the Parochial Church Council, consideration has also been given to improving the facilities within the Church for those who come to visit or worship. Early in the 20th century central heating was added. Later improvements include a new parish room, kitchen and toilet. But it doesn't stop there and work will continue with plans for future improvements that not only enable the work of the Church to be a centre for Christian faith and witness to the community but also as a place for social events.

If you have never been inside, pay a visit. The Church is normally open and whilst it might look imposing from the outside once inside you will find it both light and welcoming. Our new prayer corner in the north aisle of the Church is there for anyone needing somewhere to go for guiet reflection or prayer.
