War memories from Josiah Hayes

Josiah remembers, just before or just after the start of the war there used to be an airplane called Vickers Virginia, red in colour, 2 winged and it used to take off from Henlow Aerodrome. There would be a man standing on each wing, when the plane got to a certain height they would jump off and open parachutes – He thinks this is how parachutes were tested in those days. Here is a picture from Player's Cigarettes, showing parachute training, just as Josiah described, just towards the end of the Vickers Virgina Service!

At the same time Josiah and his friends were walking back from Green Lane, Hinxworth when 2 Tiger Moth airplanes flew over and suddenly came in very low and landed in the meadow that they were in. They ran towards them to have a look at them. When they got near the planes, the children turned round. The children thought they were being chased as they ran back up the meadow, but the pilots were coming up the meadow to take off again. The pilots got out and the children spoke to them and asked why they had landed in the meadow. The pilots told the children, that one of the pilots got lost and they had landed so that the pilots could swap planes. Why? Because the original pilot would have had to do his training all over again!

Dunton Parish Council

At the July meeting of Dunton Parish Council, we were pleased to welcome two new Councillors: Tim Fowler and Pete Dixon. A full list of Parish Councillors and their contact details can be found in the directory in this edition of Dunton News. We do still have one vacancy on the Council and would be pleased to hear from any Dunton resident who may be interested in joining us.

Members of the Council are elected every four years or co-opted as vacancies occur and commit their time on a purely voluntary basis. Amongst other things the Council has responsibility for some of the overall maintenance and appearance of the village - in Dunton this includes some of the street lighting, the cemetery and roadside verges. Recently we have been discussing and taking action about the state of footpaths in the village, and have agreed to purchase more spring bulbs for planting later in the year. We can also make small grants to local organisations for the benefit of village residents.

Meetings of the Parish Council are open to all Dunton residents to attend and observe, to ask questions of the Council, or request items for discussion. The meetings are held six times a year, on the third Wednesday of alternate months, starting at 7.30 pm, in the Village Hall. The next two meetings are on the 18.9.19 and 20.11.19. Details of the agenda are posted on the Parish Council noticeboard.



Developer Puts In For Planning Permission For 37 Houses On The Edge Of Dunton



We should know for certain whether Central Bedfordshire's Local Plan will be approved by the Inspector in the coming months. In the development plan, a plot of land, assigned a reference of HAS13 by the Council, was included on the northern side of Dunton. This does not mean the Council has formerly approved it for development; it has merely proposed it, in its plan of

possible developments.



Currently there is a planning application on the same plot of land for 37 houses.

Further details about the application can be found at https://tinyurl.com/y46o9zfd and it states comments from the public can be received until 23.8.19. If you're reading this

after that date, it may be too late to comment.

Also, the decision is likely to be made at a public meeting so if you would like to attend and have your say, do let Adam Zerny or Tracey Wye know.


