

What is it?

From the 1st December 2019 residents, businesses and village groups in Dunton have been challenged to create seasonal scenes in their windows. Windows throughout the village will be decorated and the scenes will be lit consecutively each evening at 7.00 pm. Some residents are doing outside displays.

The windows will be prepared by the houses, businesses, and groups involved and a photograph of each new window will appear in Dunton's Big Weekender facebook page.

To start Dunton's Living Advent Calendar, on the 1st December 2019, lights will be turned on at 7.00 pm, where Biggleswade Road meets the High Street, also known as Vicarage Corner. Their lights are to raise money for local charities and so please be generous. The first window will be lit on the 2nd December 2019. By Christmas Eve there will be many different windows to see and enjoy as you walk through Dunton - a great way to get into the Christmas spirit. All windows once they have been unveiled will be lit until the 4th January 2020, culminating with Dunton Folk Wassail 2020 at Church Farm Dunton and at the March Hare, Dunton.

Inspectors Savage Central Beds' Local Plan

Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC)'s Local Plan attempts to show where houses will be built in the next 15 years around Biggleswade. The Plan was approved by Councillors and recently went through a Public Examination lead by Government inspectors who voiced major concerns about Local Plan.

The plan put forward by CBC included huge numbers of houses in between Biggleswade and Dunton.

The inspectors' findings criticised CBC for failing to show that it had considered all options before picking housing sites in Central Bedfordshire and said that a development south of Biggleswade was not justified in its current form because a huge development east of Biggleswade (SA4) cannot be supported without further work.

CBC has said the inspectors' criticisms have "been welcomed as an important step forward in the thorough and comprehensive process of creating and agreeing the Local Plan" and that "there are a number of areas which require some further work". Dunton Memories by Frank Chessum

Frank was born in Dunton in 1939 and lived in a small cottage in Boot Lane. The cottage was two up and two down with very small rooms, an old cast-iron range in the front room for all the cooking and heat for the house. There was no electricity and no water in the house, but there was a tap at back of the yard that served all 4 cottages. There was also a bucket toilet at the bottom of the garden. It was murder going down there in the winter!

Frank has some wonderful memories of his mum, Dorcas Morgan, whom he believes was born in Dunton Lodge in 1909. She lived there until the early 1930's when she then married Frank's dad, known to everyone as Ciss Chessum. They moved to Boot Lane.

Whilst she was growing up at the Lodge she had to attend Dunton School and the only way to get to the school was a nearly two mile walk across fields, which wasn't too bad when it was dry. However when the ground was wet or covered in snow in the winter, she would arrive late and the teachers would make her stay later in the day so she could catch up with the other children. Unfortunately, very often it was dark when she set off for home across the fields and this meant that one of her brothers would have to come and meet her. In those days teachers were hard to the children, including using a ruler across the hand to maintain discipline.

Frank remembers two village pubs from his childhood, the Wheatsheaf, now the March Hare opposite the Post office and village shop and the Three Horse Shoes which was on one corner of Boot Lane. The Bell pub was also on the opposite corner of Boot Lane, which burnt down and now there is a bungalow instead.

In Cambridge Rd there was a blacksmiths where Frank and his friends stood for ages watching him shoe horses. Some of

the wooden beams from the blacksmiths have been incorporated as internal features in the March Hare.

The Bake House was on Cambridge Road, modern houses have taken its place now.

In those days Boot Lane wasn't made up, it was very rough with great potholes mostly full of water.

Frank remembers a steam lorry that used to come down Boot Lane to pick up vegetables that were going to the London markets and of course that was a big thing for the children in Dunton in those days to see.


