Crib and Backgammon at the March Hare

As part of Dunton's Big Weekender a crib and backgammon night was held at the March Hare, with quite a number of people attending to learn how to play these traditional games.

Crib, or cribbage, is a card game in which players use a peg board to record their scores – the first to 121 wins. Scoring takes place as players take turns to play their cards, and then by totalling up the score held in each hand. It seems quite complex to the uninitiated, but it can be picked up fairly quickly and it's a very sociable game.

Backgammon is a board game, where 2 players roll dice in turn to move their counters around the table, in the opposite direction to their opponent. The player who is able to 'bear off' all of their counters first, wins. Its simple to learn, but as players gain experience they learn more of the tactics required to be a good player of the game.

Both games are played regularly at the March Hare, and new players or those wishing to learn are always welcome.

The crib team meet every Thursday evening from 8.00 pm, and play in a local league from mid September to mid April.

Backgammon is played on the third Monday of each month, again from 8.00 pm.

New players can come along to any of these sessions or can meet with one of the backgammon 'club' or crib team on another night at the March Hare – there is often one of us around!



Christmas Fruit Cake

Ingredients

You will need an 8" deep cake tin lined twice with greased paper (I always use butter)
175g currants
175g sultanas
110g glacé cherries, halved
3 tablespoons dark rum
150g room temperature butter
150g soft brown sugar
3 large eggs at room temperature
225g plain flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
2 tablespoons ground almonds
Grated rind from 1 lemon and 1

Method

orange

- 1. You need to begin this the night before you intend to bake.
- 2. Weigh out all the fruit and peel and put in a bowl, then pour the rum into the bowl and give a good mix, cover with film and leave for a good 12 hours.
- 3. Pre-heat your oven....170 c, gas mark 3, 325 f.
- Put the butter, sugar, flour, baking powder and eggs into a mixer and beat until pale and fluffy. Do not worry if the mixture curdles slightly. Once mixed add the ground almonds. Once combined fold in the soaked fruits.
- Spoon the mixture into your tin. Cut two small circles of greased paper to fit on top of the cake whilst cooking.
- 6. Place your cake in the centre of the oven and bake for 2 to 2.5 hours. All ovens will vary. If you are unsure get a skewer and stab down the centre of the cake and if it comes out clean your cake is cooked.
- 7. Leave your cake to cool in the tin for 30 minutes before turning out onto a wired rack. Place a clean, dry tea towel over your cake whilst it cools.

8. Once cold, wrap your cake in grease proof paper and then wrap in foil and store in an air tight container. If you like, you can feed your cake fortnightly with more rum.

The cake is delicious with or without a fondant covering. Why not try a slice with some lush Christmassy custard? These generally start appearing in the shops at the beginning of December or you can get some nice boozy creams or just eat with ice cream.

Dunton Lower School



It was a complete surprise to learn that Central Bedfordshire Council were going to replace the 'temporary' classrooms which only those with longest memories can remember being put in place over 20 years ago. During the last 6 months Mrs Sheehan and the staff have been involved in a huge amount of extra work, considering bids,

analysing plans and consulting. The timetable was originally to be work starting after Easter, and completion by the beginning of September.

Once the contract for a brick building was awarded to Savoys, there was a small delay when the council insisted that a full dig of the footprint of the building was dug to ensure that there were no archaeological sites underneath. None were found, however, there was a well about a foot under the playground. This then flooded the whole area and a pump had to be rapidly brought in to pump it all out. As a church school, you might say that this was reminiscent of Noah's Flood. Then a mains cable was discovered and had to be checked out. These both led to a delay in the start of the works, by a couple of weeks.

It has had a huge impact on the life of the school and it has been due to the efforts of Mrs Sheehan and the staff that school life has been able to continue running smoothly. In large schools, a project like this would be managed by the school business manager but in a small school like Dunton it falls completely on the staff and they have responded magnificently. The children have continued to achieve wonderfully as the local School Improvement Partner commented during her recent visit

The site manager Christine has been extremely helpful in keeping a window open in the screen so the children can see what is happening.

The Friends of Dunton Church held their first Dunton Dawdle on 21st June 1992. Over 100 tickets were sold and it was such a success that it became an annual event until 2004 only missing 2001 which was cancelled due to Foot and Mouth restrictions. Early routes were about 6 miles long.

The route varied from year to year but they usually began at Millow Hall Farm and always finished at Millow Hill Farm with a cream tea and Maynards Ice Cream. Participants brought a picnic lunch which was transported to the venue by car. Depending on the route taken, lunch was held at either Eyeworth Lodge, Stratton Farm or Thistley Farm. For entertainment along the way a quiz or scavenger hunt was provided.

In 2008 it was decided to organise a Dunton Dawdle in memory of Ken Lee who had sadly passed away in 2007. A donation was made to The Primrose Unit at Bedford Hospital who had helped Ken.

Central Beds proposing huge expansion of Biggleswade, Sandy, Tempsford/Everton in public consultation

Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has launched a public consultation on its draft Local Plan. The Local Plan details CBC's proposals for housing developments over the next 20 years.

The plan could see masses of new housing in our area and seems to propose a huge eastern expansion of Biggleswade joining it to the villages of Dunton and Sutton and a merging of Sandy into Tempsford.

The consultation was complex, but is now closed.

Documents to be considered by residents of Dunton are the Central Bedfordshire Draft Local Plan (July 2017) and the 'Site Assessment Forms (Housing)' for Biggleswade and Dunton where you will the associated reports showing the sites CBC see as appropriate to pursue.

Dunton

Aside from more houses along the roadside near to the roundabout, the report mentions site NLP324 (35-50 houses) as being suitable. This site is just to the north of the village off Cambridge Road. However, this is misleading, if you have a look at the Biggleswade report it states CBC wants to pursue a huge (380 hectares) site which includes all the land between Biggleswade and Sutton/Dunton.

Biggleswade

One site alone includes all of the land north to Sutton and west to Dunton covering some 380 hectares, or to put in another way, an area the size of 938 football pitches. The proposals mention some 6,840 houses being built there. Most of the other proposed sites are on the eastern side but in addition to this massive site, there are a further 639 houses proposed, covering an additional 30 hectares. You can see them on the map as ALP204/ALP244/ALP474/NLP271/NLP407/NLP494/NLP433. These sites would see the town doubled in size.

How do these allocations compare with the proposals for other towns and villages around Central Bedfordshire? The total of new houses proposed for Ampthill, Dunstable, Flitwick, Shefford and Stotfold combined is 1,455 houses.
