This quantity gives us a price that is usually about 5 pence a litre cheaper than would otherwise be possible. 

East West Rail announces five routes for Bedford-Cambridge rail line

The long-awaited public announcement of the route shortlist for the Bedford-Cambridge section of East West Rail was made in January. The current consultation ended on the 11.3.19. The next consultation will be in 2021 on one final route. The final decision is expected to be made later that year.

East West Rail says it expects to complete the Bedford-Cambridge section of the line by the mid-2020s.

3 of the five routes will have huge repercussions for residents of Sutton and Eyeworth. Each route shows a hatched 'corridor', wider in some places than others. We do not know where in the corridors the route would go. The 3 routes which affect Sutton and Eyeworth are

Route A - Is the quickest route at 76 minutes from Oxford to Cambridge and appears to be the cheapest at £2bn. However, the corridor cuts right through Sutton and Eyeworth. It also runs very close to the RSPB and would involve relocating Sandy Station to the south and does not include the cost of a new Bassingbourn station.

Route C - Would take 80 minutes and involve sharing the main line around Sandy with existing routes. Seems to involve a new station at Tempsford but retaining Sandy station. It would cost £2.5bn and would have a similar impact to Route A on Sutton and Eyeworth, It would go via Bassingbourn and runs very close to the RSPB. Cost does not include the new Bassingbourn station.

Route D - Similar to Route C except would come out of north Bedford and would take 83 minutes and again cost £2.5bn.

Dunton Memories by Frank Chessum and Walter Hills

Frank Chessum has been writing about his memories of growing up in Dunton on facebook. Not everyone accesses facebook and so here are some of Frank's World War 2 memories of Dunton as a boy, with those of Walter Hills.

During World War 2 one of the first things that Frank can remember are the aircraft. If the villagers heard one, everybody ran outside to look. They all knew what it was by its sound. During the war time there nearly always were some about because there was Bassingbourn Airdrome not very far away across the fields, about 9 miles. Frank saw some dog fights or air to air combat and bombers coming and going. He was too young to remember when Dunton was bombed, but Frank and his friends played in the bomb holes as

Apparently, Dunton was bombed during the war. Frank says the bomb holes at Millow and near to the waterworks are only just visible. He thinks that if you go through Millow from Dunton and at the far end there are 2 thatched cottages on the right and the entrance to Millow House on the left. Well just to the right of that entrance where there are bushes, there should be a fairly large bomb hole. He also thinks that the one near the waterworks is still fairly visible.

In 1944 hundreds of army lorries and army personal arrived in the village. They parked both sides of Boot Lane and anywhere else they could find in Dunton. Frank remembers his mum cooking meals for a few of the soldiers as did all the villagers. He thinks that they were getting ready for -D-Day.

Walter Hills remembered that during the war it was thought that about 350 soldiers were camped around Dunton and 500 around Hinxworth and Edworth. The Three Horseshoes had a flat roof and in Dunton a few soldiers laid waiting, hidden, from the Hinxworth and Edworth soldiers. Their surprise didn't work because a few of the Edworth and Hinxworth soldiers arrived, hidden in a hay wagon! Dunton soldiers had to surrender to the Edworth and Hinxworth soldiers. This was the only time Dunton was invaded during the war! Is this the same incident that Frank remembers!

Walter Hills also remembered that during the war when Mr Bennett was Landlord, when the doodlebugs came over children playing around the March Hare (in those days it was the Wheatsheaf) would slide down the shoot to safety and shelter in the cellar.

Towards the end of the war Frank remembers seeing doodlebugs with what sounded like 2 stroke engines putputting across the sky and not all that high up. When the engine stopped everybody ran inside. What good that would have done he has no idea. The doodlebug glided on and hit the ground at Thistley with a big bang that made the ground shake. It was too late in the day to go look but the next morning all the boys walked and had a look and ended up bringing pieces of the doodle bug home which they kept them for years but they are lost now. The doodlebug was the V-1 flying bomb. It was an early cruise missile and the only production aircraft to use a pulsejet for power.

In the war time Frank's dad didn't go into the forces because he worked on the land instructing the Women's Land Army (WLA). The WLA was a British civilian organisation created during the First and Second World Wars so women could work in agriculture, replacing men called up to the military. Women who worked for the WLA were commonly known as Land Girls. Frank's dad was then put to work at a factory at the bottom of Shortmead Street, Biggleswade where they repaired aircraft and military vehicle parts. All was very hush hush at the time. Does anyone remember the name of this factory?


